



## WEST JORDAN TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

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The Traffic Management Program allows residents to understand traffic patterns within their neighborhood and request further evaluation.

Please fill out the form on the second page with at least 10 of your neighbor's signatures and submit it to the address listed. The deadline for application is **July 15** for allocation within the next fiscal year.

**The following steps are a typical progression of a resident request for a traffic calming project:**

**Residents start the process by submitting the application: *this application will let the City know where there is a perceived problem.***

1. City receives an application for Neighborhood Traffic Management before the deadline.
2. A traffic Study is completed by the City – traffic counts and speeds are collected.
3. If the street qualifies for the program based on the traffic study it will be ranked against other qualifying projects – the applicant will receive additional communications. If the street does not qualify a final letter is sent to the applicant with the results and an explanation.
4. After the traffic study demonstrates the street qualifies for the program, the process will move forward with a neighborhood meeting and plan development.
5. The traffic calming plan is mailed to all the residents living on the street. Residents vote either YES or NO. If the YES vote is greater than 50 percent the project moves forward.
6. The project is bid out for construction by prioritization and available funding.
7. The project is constructed. After the project has been in place for at least one year a 2<sup>nd</sup> traffic study is conducted to measure the project's effectiveness.
