"I have what is called 'essential tremors," Hunter explained. "Some call it a disability; I have to disagree


because it results in such beauty."

## What to Know for When it Starts to Snow

We've all been there before, you wake up in the morning to prepare for another day of work, you look outside, and BAM Mother Nature brought a huge snowstorm. Your driveway is covered in snow, your mailbox is covered in snow and your car, which is parked on the street, is also covered in snow. The first thing you probably want to do is climb back in bed, but before you do that... do your neighbors and city a solid: move your car off the road.

Here's why: West Jordan City ordinance 7-3-10 prohibits parking a car, or semitrailer, on the street when it is snowing, or snow is already on the street. The ordinance is in effect from November 1st through April 30th of the following year. If you are parked on the street during the storm you could face a violation and pay a ticket. But aside from just potentially paying up, you may be the reason your street isn't getting plowed. While some streets CAN still be plowed with cars





parked along the side, many plow drivers will wait until the street is clear to avoid damaging any cars as well as their own equipment.

There are more than 800 lane miles of streets in the city of West Jordan. The city's plow drivers get to those streets by priority.

#### **CITY STREET PRIORITY CATEGORIES:**

**Priority One:** Arterial and major collector streets.

**Priority Two:** Generally, subdivision collector streets.

**Priority Three:** All other residential through streets, (excluding cul-de-sacs).


**Priority Four:** Cul-de-sacs and other dead-end streets. The city incurs proportionally more time and

costs clearing snow from cul-de-sacs than on typical "uninterrupted" stretches of streets. Because of the high cost-to-benefit ratio, and lower traffic volume, cul-de-sacs and dead-end streets have the lowest priority, and will be the last areas plowed.


Something else to keep in mind; not all roads are the city's responsibility. Some roads belong to the state which are maintained by the Utah Department of Transportation, including:

- · Redwood Road
- Bangerter Highway
- 7000 South from the Jordan River to Redwood Road
- 9000 South from the Jordan River to 5600 West
- U-111 from New Bingham Highway to the Northern City border
- Mountain View Corridor
- New Bingham Highway from 7800 South to west of U-111

Another important thing to note; police won't be able to ticket ALL cars parked on the street. If it's a snowy commute they are likely responding to crashes or helping drivers who get stuck in the snow. It's best not to bombard dispatch with a list of your neighbors' license plate numbers, when they're already receiving calls about potential crashes with injuries. Think two steps ahead: check the local weather, so you can move your car off the road if it's likely going to snow.

## City of West Jordan Offering Curbside Christmas Tree Pick-up

Every year, the City of West Jordan offers its residents the option to pick up and dispose of their real Christmas trees. This year it is no different. Starting December 25th through January 21st, residents can place their Christmas trees curbside on their trash collection day. Residents may also opt to drop off their tree at a designated drop-off location.

#### The three drop-off locations include:

- The parking lot at the County Pool/Gene Fulmer Rec Center located at 8125 S. 2200 W.
- The parking lot of Constitution Park located at the southeast corner of 3285 W. 7000 S.
- The south parking lot at the West Jordan Soccer Complex located on the west side of 4000 W. at about 8070 S.

Trees will be delivered to the Trans-Jordan Landfill to be composted. Please do not bag your trees, be sure that all your ornaments, tinsel, and other décor are removed. If your tree has been flocked (given a treatment to make it look like snow is on the branches) it will not be collected. This program is only for real trees, artificial trees will not be accepted. ## When it Snow: Check Fire Hydrants

#### WINTER FIRE HYDRANT MAINTENANCE FROM THE WEST JORDAN FIRE DEPARTMENT

This small act is critical and could save lives. When it snows, you are used to shoveling the snow off your driveway, sidewalks, and around your mailbox. This year don't forget about the fire hydrant that may be in front of your home. If

there is a hydrant near your property be aware of the things you can do to ensure firefighters can access the hydrant when needed.

- · Shovel or snow blow at least 3-feet of space around the hydrant.
- Maintain an open space between the street and the front of the hydrant.
- These clearing should go all the way to the ground, when possible, but not less than one foot below the hydrant caps.



It's a simple and quick act that can save many lives in the case of a fire.
